

IADIS Multi Conference on Computer Science and Information Systems 2009



The IADIS Multi Conference on Computer Science and Information Systems (MCCSIS 2009) was hosted in Algarve, Portugal, 17-23 June, 2009.

This Conference addressed two main subjects: Computer Science and Information Systems. The Multi Conference was organized into fifteen conferences according to several themes and it aimed to cover both technical as well non-technological issues related to developments within Computer Science and Information Systems.
